ROSANNE CASH

One of the country's pre-eminent singer-songwriters, Rosanne Cash has released 15 albums of extraordinary songs that have earned four Grammy Awards, 12 Grammy nominations and numerous other accolades for songwriting and sound recordings. Also an accomplished author, Cash's 2010 memoir Composed garnered widespread praise from critics and landed on The New York Times bestseller list.

Cash is a music community catalyst, often bringing together giants of American roots music for various events and providing a valued voice in documenting modern music history. In 2021, Cash was the first female composer to receive the MacDowell Medal, awarded since 1960 to an artist who has made an outstanding contribution to American culture.

Grammy-winning musician, Grammy-nominated producer and visionary banjo virtuoso Alison Brown is one of the most multi-faceted minds in roots music. Although Alison began her musical career as a teenager in the Southern California Bluegrass scene, she has earned her reputation as one of today's most forward-thinking and innovative banjo players. Taking her instrument far beyond its Appalachian roots, Alison blends Bluegrass and jazz influences into a sonic tapestry that has garnered widespread praise and recognition. Her masterful skill and creativity have earned her acclaim from national tastemakers including The Wall Street Journal, CBS Sunday Morning, NPR and USA Today.

Recognized with honors including the University of Central Arkansas' Fellowship in Music and the Distinguished Achievement Award from the International Bluegrass Music Association, Brown was inducted into the American Banjo Museum Hall of Fame in 2019.
